# **Dormitory Introduction**

### 1. Dormitory Organization

- The Natural Sciences (Suwon) Campus dormitory, known as *Bongryonghaksa* (봉룡학사/鳳龍學舍), is comprised of 5 dormitory buildings, known as In-, Ui-, Ye-, Ji-, and Shin-gwan, all of which are managed directly by the university.
- The Humanities and Social Sciences (Seoul) Campus dormitory, known as *Myeongnyunhaksa* (명륜학사/明倫學舍), is comprised of E, G, C, I, K and M-Houses, and leased studio accommodation.

### 2. Campus map

• In-, Ui-, Ye-, and Shin-gwan are located in the university, but Ji-gwan is located in front of the north gate of the university (10m away).

  - Students supposed to be on gap-years on 2019-fall semester can not apply. (Students On gap-year on Oct.1 2019 can be handled to leave dormitory.)

### 2. Not Qualified Applier

- Those who are not prohibited from living in the dormitory because of penalty points
- Those who did not receive an academic warning (under GPA 1.75) in the previous semester

### 5. Matters to be considered

- The dormitory's available places are all filled during Stage 1 of the application process. Only unpaid places are available for re-selection on Stage 2, so the Stage 2 selection success rate is extremely low.
- If you are selected but do not pay by the deadline, your selection will be cancelled automatically.
- Rooms are assigned according to the selection of check-in date and you can not enter the dorm before the selected check-in date. Therefore, carefully choose the check-in date. You can enter the dorm after the selected check-in date but the dorm fee during the unused period can not be refunded.

### 8. How to Apply for Admission

 After paying SKKU's enrollment fee, freshmen should go to the university homepage (https://www.skku.edu), and join Kingo Portal. Then it will be possible to apply for dormitory admission.



- The admission application system will not be in English, so you may need to download the "Guidance for Dormitory Application on GLS" file.
- After submitting your admission application you can modify the contents until the end of the application period. After this period, modification is impossible.
- To confirm what you apply:



'application' appeared and when clicking it, the detailed information of your apply is appearing)

### 9. How to Check the Results and Invoices



- You cannot check whether your application has been successful before the results are announced. After the results are announced, success/failure are appearing.
- Send the total payment (maintenance fee + meal fee + deposit) by bank transfer to the account specified in your individual invoice.
- Each invoice will have a single-use account number. The account holder name will be the applicant's name. Payment can only be made as an exact amount during the period shown on the invoice.
- Take care in completing the payment fully, as failure to pay by the deadline will result in automatic cancellation of your admission.

### 10. Selection Rules

- Freshmen in fall semester, 2019 (undergraduate level, graduate school, and students who have transferred from another university) will be given priority in selection, and other students will be given priority in their first preference of dormitory and room type based on their previous grades.
- After assigning rooms based on first preference, if there are still vacant rooms then applicants who were not selected for their first preference but who chose the room types with vacancies as their second preference will be selected based on their grades. Therefore, students who do not choose preferences 2-7 will be last in order of selection.
- When enrolling at SKKU, students who are guaranteed a dormitory room because of their major or special case must also qualify to be accepted. They will be given priority if they applied and registered in Stage 1 of the application procedure. If they were not selected for their first preference of dormitory because of their grades, they can be assigned their 2nd to 7th preference or a random room.

### 11. Assigning Rooms

- Room assignment will be done after payment. It is policy to put students of same year together. When applying, you select your sleeping type and it is considered for dorm management to allocate rooms.
- Graduate students who lived in the dormitory during summer vacation, who are selected for fall semester, 2019, and who applied for early check-in on Aug.30, and who applied for admission in stage 1 will usually be assigned the same room so they don't have to move.
  - Exceptional: Undergraduate students who are living in on 2~3, 5~10F of Shin-gwan A / Dormate selectees)
- If Students who are supposed to live in the same room where he have lived in summer vacation wants to change room, he should visit dorm office and apply for the room change until Aug. 20. (Tue) 17:00.
- Bongryonghaksa do not have the dormitory only for the foreigner, so students from all country can be room mate each other.

### 3. What to Use and How to Use Them

- Residents who chose a meal plan when applying for admission to the dormitory: swipe your student ID tag (card or mobile phone) to use meal tickets automatically.
- Residents who did not choose a meal plan when applying, and non-residents: pay by card at the counter or buy tickets by cash at the vending machine.
- The number of electronic meal tickets stored on your student ID card which you can use at each mealtime is limited (up to 5 times a day), and these cannot be given to other people.

### 4. Dormitory Meal Tickets Apply System

• Residents who chose a meal plan when applying for admission to the dormitory and pay in bulk can use the cafeteria at discounted amount.

### Select 1 meal plan among 6 type.

0.5 meal, 1 meal, 1.5 meals, 2 meals, 2.5 meals, No meal (personally purchase the meal ticket)

-"1 meal", "1.5 meals" etc means the average of the available meal coupon during semester.

For example, "1 meal" means that you eat averagely 1 meal per day during semester

(100 days) not meaning of only 1 meal per day. Therefore you can use the 100 tickets when you want to use it.

- Residents who did not choose a meal plan when applying, and non-residents: pay by card at the counter or buy tickets by cash at the vending machine.
- Selected meal plan can be used in the dormitory where you live in and can not be used in other dormitory or cafeteria in campus.

### 5. Quantity and Price of Meal coupon by chosen options

- You can use a discounted rate if you choose a meal plan when applying for admission.
- Meal tickets bought at the vending machine, or meals bought by card at the counter, cost \(\formalfont\)4,000 each. (as shown in the "No meals chosen" column in the table below)

### 6. Applying to Change Meal Plan (adding and refunding tickets)

- To give opportunity to change the number of tickets after experiencing the cafeteria at the beginning of the semester, there will be a time to apply to change the number of tickets once during the semester.
- Period for application: Sep. 6. (Fri) 09:00 ~ Sep. 16. (Mon) 13:00
- How to calculate the meal plan price by adding tickets or claiming a refund

Options	How to Calculate
Applying to add tickets	You should pay the difference between the prices of the new and old meal plans. You will receive the total number of tickets for that plan minus the number you have already used.
Applying for refund	minus the number you have already used. You will be refunded the total price paid for your originally-chosen plan, minus the price for the tickets used so far at the rate of your new plan, minus the price for the remaining days charged at the rate of your new plan.

- There will be no opportunity to change the number of tickets other than in this period, and there will be no refund for unused meal tickets at the end of the semester.

# **Dormate (Applying for Roommates)**

### 1. Purpose


 'Dormate' means applying for roommate at SKKU dormitory. This is to benefit exemplary residents who have been following the dormitory rules. It gives a chance for people who match well to live together and can increase satisfaction in dormitory life


### 2. Eligibility for Application

- Students who did not receive dormitory penalty points during spring semester, 2019, and summer vacation
- 2019-fall semester freshmen cannot apply.
- Students applying for admission in Stage 1
- Graduates students can apply for Dormate
- Students who choose 2 people 1 room (Ye/Ji/Shin-gwan), 4 people 1 room (In/Shin-gwan), 6 people 3 rooms (Shin-gwan) as their first preference when applying for admission
- If students who are supposed to live in the same room that they have lived in are selected on Dormate, they can be moved to the dormate floor.

### 3. How to Apply & Check the Result

- Dormate application is a part of the admission application procedure. If you are ineligible for Dormates, then this part of the procedure will be deactivated.
- Dormates must assign each other as chosen roommates in their respective applications.
   They must choose the same type of room select 1 person for 2-people-1-room, 3 for 4-people-1-room.






- For 6-people-3-rooms, 2, 4, or 6 people need to assign each other as dormates. (3 or 5 people as one group are not applicable.)
- For detailed information on Dormate application, download the GLS Admission Application Help file.
- Only admitted when all applicants are done with registration. Selected students will receive a message on Aug. 12. (Mon). after 15:00

### 4. Dormate Rule

### (1) Ineligible Cases

Applicants who do not select each other as Dormates
 (e.g. A selected B, but B did not select A or selected other students, or even If one person in 4 people 1 room or 6 people 3 rooms is left out for the application



- Selected Dormates who are assigned a different room type, are not selected for the dormitory, or did not register admission
- Students who choose a different gender, graduate students, freshmen, or ineligible Dormates
- The computer will automatically select cases which meet the selection criteria exactly, using students' names and ID numbers, so if you input details incorrectly then the responsibility lies with the applicant.

### (2) Method of Selection and Number of Applicants to Be Selected

- Only admitted when all applicants are done with registration. Selected students will receive a message on Aug. 12. (Mon)
- When selected, you must move to that room. It will not be possible to change or cancel this.

### (3) Dormate Life Rules

- When selected as a Dormate, if responsibility for penalty points is deemed to be shared, then the points will be doubled as additional punishment.
- In terms of Dormate, there are frequently asked questions are available on **dorm** website ► FAQ. Leave a questions on Q&A for further questions.

# **Submission of Tuberculosis Test Results**

### 1. Rules Regarding Submission of Tuberculosis Test Results ★ ★ ★

- According to the Ministry of Education policy, all admitted residents must submit the tuberculosis check-up test report which conducted within a year after the check-out.
- If you do not turn in the test result on the check-in date, <u>you won't be able to</u> check-in.
- But, there are exceptions or postpone for submission in certain condition as following:

\*Check your latest date of TB(check x-ray)test result.

- Only applicants with clearly-written name, gender, date of birth, date of chest x-ray and clear results (shown as Normal/Tuberculosis not found/Full recovery) can be accepted. (need to turn in TB test result not the x-ray film.)
- The check-up result must be submitted on site at the entrance processing place on the check-in date (mail delivery unacceptable).
- Freshmen and admitted residents are recommended to arrange the schedule to receive a free campus health checkup. (Refer to the next page)
- Tuberculosis can usually be diagnosed by chest x-ray, so just visit a public health centre, internal medicine clinic, or hospital equipped with an x-ray machine. The results can take 1-3 days depending on the clinic visited, so please bear your check-in date in mind and have the health check-up in advance.

# Admission(Check-in) Procedure

### 1. Admission Procedure

- You can only check in from your chosen check-in date onwards. Before that date you will also be unable to enter your room or store luggage in it.
- Check-in procedure: Bring your tuberculosis check-up result and your I.D. card (Korean ID card; Alien Registration Certificate; Passport). ► Check your room number on the notice on the management office wall or on GLS. ► Receive your room key, entry card, and information leaflets. ► Go to your assigned room. ► Check the in-room facilities. ► Submit confirmation of admission online.
- Possible check-in times: 09:00–17:00 (Outside these hours, for residents' safety and convenience, the entry of accompanying family into the building and the renting of a cart can be limited.) However, if you chose to check-in on Aug.30.(Fri), 2019, because residents who have stayed during the summer vacation will be checking out, you can check in after 13:00. To reduce congestion on check-in days, temporary management offices will be operating at the locations in the table below.

### 2. Admission Period Assistance Details

- Receiving parcels: If you send parcels to the dormitory 3-5 days before the check-in date then they will be stored in the parcel storage room on delivery. (However, please be aware that parcels may be damage or loss. Also please write your name and phone number on the box.)
- Borrowing a cart: You can borrow a cart in each dormitory, but due to limited space in the elevator, it may be crowded, and because of many people it may take a long time. It will be easier if you bring your belongings in wheeled suitcases, or you can prepare your own small cart.
- For the early check-in or the regular check-in, we provide free campus parking ticket. (There is an exception of Ji-gwan since the building is located outside the campus.)

### 3. Instructions

- Dormitory life is communal and the room is small, so please do not bring things which could give your roommate discomfort, or prohibited items with you.
- To avoid discomfort to your roommate, try not to bring your family into the room or aisle during your stay, and try to do your own cleaning and laundry, not relying on your family.


# 7 Dormitory Life Rules

### 1. Dormitory Etiquette

- As dormitory is a communal space, we had established the regulations on safety / communal living / hygiene, if resident who violates the rule, then the penalty points will be given. depending on the level of imposed penalties, you can be moved out, or lose the right to apply for dormitory. Therefore, you need to take special attention to the following materials. (Refer to the next page)
- Also we impose a curfew to reduce the roommate or neighbor's issue on making noise at night. Curfew time is Monday to Friday 01:00~05:00 a.m. (There is no curfew on Saturday and Sunday.), you still can pass the gate but you will receive 3 penalty points. But, graduate students do not have curfew and during exam period, we temporarily suspend the curfew for undergraduate students as well.

### 2. Multi-Outlet Usage

- **1** Electricity overloads blocker: To protect the electronic from the overloads
- 2 Power switch: To control the power by using switch from going on/off.
- 3) Cable length less than 3 meters: Longer the cable gets, more heat it will emit.
- 4 Multi-outlet with less than 4 sockets: To prevent ground fault and electric shock, must use the one that has 4 sockets or less.
- **5**Ground type plug: When accident occurs, it protects cable routes.



# 3. Voluntary Sleep Out Reporting System

- When a student sleep out of the dorm for long period of time(longer than five days of weekdays), we make contact to the student or guardian for the safety.
- If students plan to stay out of the dorm should report through GLS in advance. We will not contact guardian unless students report themselves. Therefor self-reporting is highly recommended.

<sup>\*</sup>The curfew will be canceled on Saturday and Sunday from 1 am to 5 am.

(Even if the curfew is canceled, problems such as non-resident entrance are punished equally)

- ▶ Total point 20 or more: Have to go out from dormitory, lost right that apply for dormitory forever
- ▶ Total point 15 or more: Have to go out from dormitory, lost right that apply for dormitory a year
- ▶ Total point 10 or more: Have to go out from dormitory, No lost right that apply for dormitory (but, violation demerits 15 days before retirement are carried over to the next semester or vacation and totaled)
- ▶ For the repeated violation or 'Dormate' students can be imposed on doubled demerit points
- ▶ In case of forced eviction, student must vacate the room within 4 days after demerit announcement
- ▶ We consider residents who don't reside in the corresponding dorm as non-residents, so we shall impose the same demerits on them
- ▶ It is possible to grant a demerit to all roommates about matters involving shared responsibility
- ▶ If the management staff catch a violation, he or she should turn over it to assistant lifestyle guidance
- ▶ In principle, we give out demerit points for each violation under the above-mentioned regulations, but for violations not mentioned above, the chief operating manager or dormitory director can adjust and impose demerit points depending on the situation.

# 8 Orientation & Safety Education

### 1. Foreigner Freshmen Orientation for Dormitory

- A program that provides freshmen an overall dormitory information on Sep.5.(Thu). (Schedule can be adjusted.)
- All freshmen have to participate to this event which includes fire fighting safety education, introduction of dormitory facility and resident regulation, and main programs.

### 2. Fire Drill & Safety Education

- Simulate emergency situation by practicing the actual training such as evacuating the building through fire exit, demonstration on fire hydrant and fire extinguisher use. Fire safety and safety education will be given by an expert
- Residents are required to attend more than once a year
- Fire fighting safety education on Sep. 18.(Wed) Fire drill on Sep.17. (Tue). (Schedule can be adjusted.)

# 9 Open Kitchen

- Open kitchen is for foreign students in the dormitory who should cook their own meal necessarily because of cultural differences.
- Current users who will leave the dormitory after summer vacation should return the container box when check-out. If you don't return it with the key, the fee for the container (10,000 won) will be deducted from your deposit. Also open kitchen entry is not possible right after the check-out.
- Summer vacation users who will live in the dormitory during fall semester can use the open kitchen without registering again if you are the intended users of currently using open kitchen.
- If you want to stop using the kitchen, refrigerator container should be returned to the dormitory office.

- If the current Ui-gwan open kitchen users are allocated to other dormitories not Ui-gwan, students should follow the check-out process and register for In-gwan open kitchen.
- For those who are using In-gwan open kitchen and want to use it for fall semester, students don't need to register again regardless of the dormitory for fall semester.
- Registration for 2019 fall semester will be on Aug. 27. (Tue) 10:00. For those who want to use the kitchen for fall semester, we will get applications online. This application will be made on a first-come-first-serve basis.

- If residents plan to leave in the mid-session need to come to dorm office to turn in paper works and agree on refund policy. Therefore you need to visit office during our office hours and even if you already have checked out your room, the office check out date is the date you submit paper works at office.
- If you are expelled because of penalty points, or you decide to leave mid-session because of health or other personal reasons, the same mid-session refund rule applies.
- The deposit will be refunded in full unless the room is left in a state of uncleanliness or disrepair, or fixings are missing, in which case the sum needed to clean, repair or replace things will be deducted from the deposit and any remainder will be refunded. (Poor cleaning: ₩10,000; key loss: ₩10,000; entry card loss: ₩10,000; damaged/lost equipment: necessary sum to fix/replace)
- All refunds take about 3 weeks to be deposited in the bank account which was registered in the admission application. Therefore, responsibility for delay caused by inaccurate details in the application lies with the resident.
- When you leave dormitory in mid-session, if you want to refund the meal price, you need to visit cafeteria office. However, leaving dormitory before check-in will be refund fully without visiting cafeteria office.
